**RC 56674 *Marjorie Morningstar: A Novel by Herman Wouk.*** Set in the late 1930's, teenager Marjorie, decides to become an actress, against the wishes of her family. Joining a summer stock troupe, she embarks on a disastrous affair with its director. Some strong language. 1955. A re-issue.

**RC 58019 *What Dreams May Come by Richard Matheson.*** When Chris Nielsen dies in a car accident, his spirit cannot let go of his beloved wife, Ann. Now another tragedy threatens to separate them forever. Chris must risk his very soul to save her from eternal despair. 1978

**RC 53503 *I Hear Adventure Calling by Emilie Loring.*** Pretty young heiress finds unexpected romance when her summer vacation turns into a nightmare of fear and suspicion. 1948.

**RC 59617 *The Case of the Howling Dog: A Perry Mason Mystery by Erle Stanley Gardner.*** Arthur Cartright consults Perry about bequeathing property to neighbor Clinton Foley's wife, but also wants to file a complaint about Clinton's noisy dog. Then Clinton's wife is missing; and Perry finds Clinton's corpse. 1934.

**RC 58845 *Time of the Wolves: Western Stories* by Marcia Muller.** Ten short stories set in the West. In the title piece, Alma fights for survival against wolves and discovers strength through fear. In "Sisters," Lydia befriends Curious Cat, forming a bond based on loneliness. In "The Lost Coast," Sharon McCone investigates a murder. 2003.

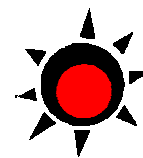
**RC 59723 *Fiddler's Green; or, A Wedding, a Ball, and the Singular Adventure of Sundry Moss: Moosepath League Chronicles* by Van Reid.** Maine, 1897. Misadventures of the Moosepath League continue: residents anticipate chairman Tobias Walton's marriage to Phileda McCannon and Mrs. Morrell's annual June ball. Tobias's aide-de-camp, Sundry Moss, ventures into a bizarre backwoods feud and meets an optimistic sailor searching for a paradise known as Fiddler's Green. 2004.

**RC 59904 *The Serpents Trail: A Maxie and Stretch Mystery* by Sue Henry.** Colorado. Sixty-three-year-old Nora McNabb and her dog Stretch arrive from Alaska to help sick friend Sarah. But

Sarah's mysterious murder at the hospital means Nora must sort out her friend's secrets and search for a killer. 2004.

**RC 59905 *Savannah; or, A Gift for Mr. Lincoln* by John Jakes.** Georgia, November 1864. As Sherman marches toward Savannah, widowed Sara Lester and her daughter Hattie are forced from their plantation. They find refuge in Savannah with Aunt Vee. They endure the dangers of war-time, including the invasion of their house, yet they also find romance. 2004.

**RC 60188 *True Believer* by Nicholas Sparks.** NY journalist Jeremy Marsh travels to Boone Creek, NC, to investigate the appearance of ghostly lights in an old cemetery. Meanwhile librarian Lexie Darnell believes her happiness lies there with those she loves. When Jeremy and Lexie meet, they begin to question their

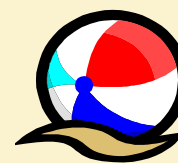
